Steps to **Becoming A Resident**

STEP 1
Complete an
Application

The first step in applying for residency is to complete and submit a short application. Upon receipt, your administrator will review the application, request additional information if necessary and contact you confirming that your application is being processed. Apply for residency at www.thebaptisthome.org/application-for-residency.

STEP 2

Meet with
a campus
administrator

A short interview will be required to assess if the Baptist Homes are able to provide for the applicant's welfare and medical needs. A review of finances will also be required if the applicant needs financial assistance. Very few applicants are ever denied admission to the Homes for inability to provide care or because of limited financial resources. Applications that fall outside of normal admission guidelines must be reviewed by the Executive Committee of the Baptist Homes.

Once your application has been reviewed and approved, we will assist you with the move-in process. We understand this move may be difficult. It is our greatest desire to provide assistance every step of the way and make the process as stress-free as possible.

When entering one of our Homes, you will need to sign a resident agreement and complete an Advance Health Care Directive. We also encourage you to have a legal estate aging plan in place. A legal estate and aging plan defines contact persons and responsible parties and may be comprised of a Durable Power of Attorney for financial health decisions, a will and/or a trust. You can develop these documents with your own advisors, or the Baptist Homes' staff can assist you.
